2016 Master Plan Update

In accordance with RSA 674:2 Master Plan; Purpose and Description, the purpose of the master plan is to set down as clearly and practically as possible the best and most appropriate future development of the area under the jurisdiction of the planning board, to aid the board in designing ordinances that result in preserving and enhancing the unique quality of life and culture of New Hampshire, and to guide the board in the performance of its other duties in a manner that achieves the principles of smart growth, sound planning, and wise resource protection.

Accordingly, in 2015 and 2016, the Salem Planning Department engaged the services of two Planning Interns to assist with updates to this important planning document. The 2001 Master Plan is the current standing comprehensive planning document for Salem. As a result of these efforts, seven (7) chapters, with the addition and corresponding amendments to the *Sustainability* and *Implementation* chapters, were substantially updated to include the most recent census data, and information from numerous federal, state and local studies and reports. Reformatting was also a part of the update process.

The updated chapters are as follows:

- Housing and Population
- Economic Development
- Natural Resources
- Historic Resources
- Recreation
- Public Utilities
- Transportation
- Sustainability
- Implementation

The planning board, in an effort to finalize its master plan update initiative, seeks to engage and garner input from boards, committees and groups involved with the topic areas identified above. Input received from these various entities will be brought back to the Planning Board for consideration in the final document. The Planning Board welcomes all input from Salem residents, property owners and stakeholders and seeks to have the master plan update completed by December 2017. 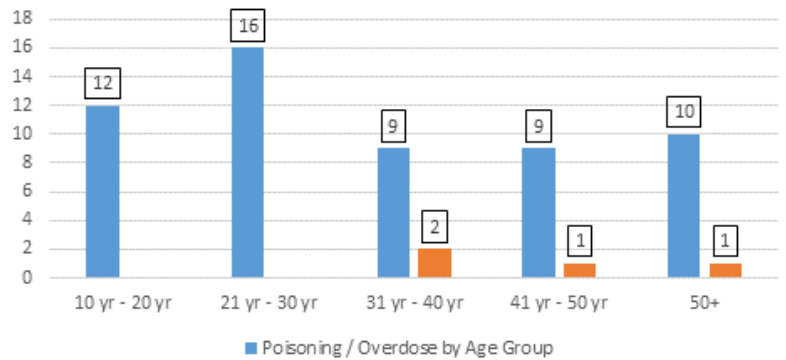
Salem Fire Department



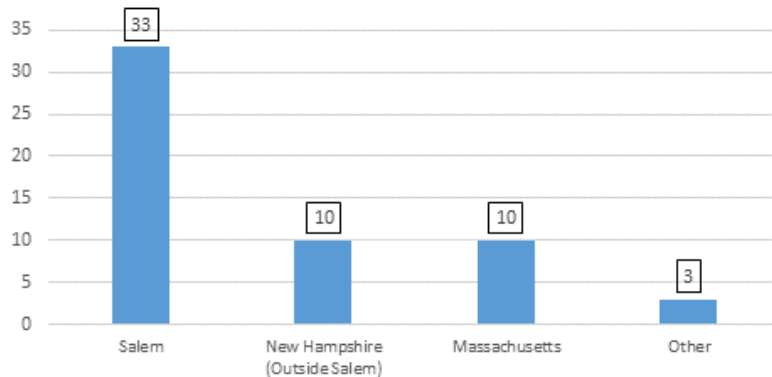
The Salem Fire Department tracks the number of overdoses and some other demographic information regarding overdoses. The below charts are some of the data they collect. As you can see, the numbers appear to be trending slightly lower than 2016. But Fire Chief Paul J. Parisi warns that we should not let our guard down. "All it takes is a bad batch of product to be sold and used in the community and our numbers could be right back up at 2016 levels. We must continue to be vigilant, and support organizations like Stand Up Salem who are working hard toward combatting the opioid crisis in our town."

2017 Poisoning / Overdose By Age Group

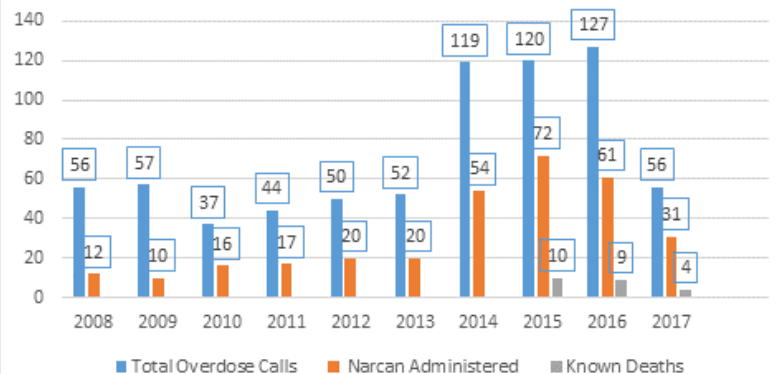


2017 Poisoning / Overdose By Patient Address

ENGINEERING DIVISION

A major milestone has been reached on Haverhill Road, Klein Drive, and Commercial Drive with the completion of base paving. Driveway paving, loam and hydro seed, final cleanup, and wearing course paving remains. Click [here](#) to watch an interview with Municipal Services Director, Roy Sorenson about this project. Reclaiming and paving on Stanley Brook Drive will begin soon. Work on Parker Circle will follow completion of other projects. Removal of concrete panels on South Broadway is underway to support installation of approximately 1,530 feet of new 12" ductile iron water main, replacing an aging 12" main. Roy Sorenson explains the project in this short [video](#). Construction on the first 50-acres of the Tuscan Village project continues, as well on many other private development projects. Demolition of the former Waste Water Treatment Facility on SARL Drive is ongoing.
