Salem Fire Department



Members of the Salem Fire Department travelled to Columbus, Ohio last week to conduct a final inspection on a new ambulance. This purchase was approved in the 2017 operating budget. The cab and chassis are made by International, and then the ambulance body is a custom body made by Horton. The vehicle was purchased from Greenwood Emergency Vehicles in Attleboro Falls, Massachusetts using the Houston-Galveston Area Consortium bid process. The final price for the ambulance was \$264,000 and is planned to be in service for approximately 6 to 8 years. The ambulance takes about 3 months to construct. Once the issues are corrected from the inspection, the ambulance will be driven back to New England where it will be lettered and have two-way radios installed. It should be in-service, protecting the Town of Salem by October 1st. Thank you to the voters who approved the funding for this purchase.



Finance

- The Finance Department has compiled the first draft of the 2018 budget. The next two weeks department heads will meet with the interim town manager, finance director, and accounting and budget manager to review their requests. After reviewing the requests with department heads, the interim town manager will make adjustments as he sees fit and will present his budget to the Board of Selectmen on October 5th.
- The Finance Department is hard at work processing payroll, paying vendor invoices, answering utility billing questions, ensuring departmental purchases comply with the town's purchasing and procurement policy, and providing support for all departments in town.

SALEM MUNICIPAL SERVICES

ENGINEERING DIVISION

Most of the 2017 Road Program is complete. Work on Parker Circle will begin soon, followed by the roads moved up from 2018 (Carriage Lane, Meadow Lane, and Sylvan Drive). Demolition of the former Waste Water Treatment Facility on SARL Drive is ongoing, with a recent milestone being removal of the 320,000 gallon (74-foot diameter by 10-foot deep) north trickling filter tank. The new 12-inch ductile iron water main on South Broadway has been pressure tested, chlorinated, flushed, and is now in use. The old main has been cut and capped and all water services and hydrants tied over to the new main. Road reconstruction, paving, and installation of the new traffic signal is next. Construction of roadways, utilities, drainage, and building foundations on the first 50-acres of the Tuscan Village project continues. Pleasant Street will be closed for about a month, starting in mid-September, to allow for replacement of the existing 48-inch diameter culvert (near the bend in the road) with a 5-foot high by 11-wide concrete box culvert. The new culvert opening is more than four times larger than the existing one, which will help address historic flooding in the area.



PUBLIC WORKS DIVISION



- Special repair --In March we received a call about a collapsing catch basin at the end of the driveway located at 75 Corinthian Drive. In May we still had not made the repair so this little boy made a wish on Facebook while blowing out his birthday candles for us to come and fix it. On August 10th we made his wish come true and made him an honorary part of the crew.
- Old crumbling stairs were removed from Old School House #5 and the Town Museum and were replaced with new granite steps



SALEM MUNICIPAL SERVICES

UTILITIES DIVISION

- We produced an average of 2.9 mgd of finish water for the month of August which is average for this month.
- We pumped 91 mg this month, 4 mg less than average and 1 mg more than last year during the water ban
- Canobie Lake is at 218.09' MSL, which is above normal for this time of year, last year we were at 215.95' MSL.
- We received 2.3" of rain this month, 1.5" below normal
- We replaced the faulty air release valve on the 24" raw water transmission line from Arlington on Wheeler Dam Rd. The air release valve on North Policy in Windham needs to be replaced before we switch back over to Arlington Pond.
- Installed a gate on the top of Arlington Dam to access the submerged trash racks on front face of dam for cleaning.
- Replaced the Automatic Transfer Switch (ATS) for the generator at Butler Street Sewer Lift Station
- Sent the sewer camera down sewer main and #9 Alta for reported sink hole in street, both were in fine shape.
- Sent camera to the sewer easement between Marianna and Trina to check on the roots that had blocked the main on March 2016. Nothing significant is growing back, will do root treatment in Spring until a more permanent repair can be done.
