## Human Resources

On September 13<sup>th</sup> the HR Department hosted its first of two annual employee Flu Shot Clinics in partnership with Rite Aid. It was a great success with 41 participants! The next scheduled Flu Shot Clinic for the town's employees/retirees will be held on **October 4, 2017** at the Main Street Fire Station. Notices will be sent out the week before the clinic and will be able to schedule appointments.

The HR Department will be having a biometric screening on **September 27<sup>th</sup>** in the Knightly Meeting Room. This event is open to town employees, retirees, spouses and dependents over age 18 who are enrolled in the town's health insurance plan. You must complete the online registration in order to participate. A biometric screening is a short health examination that can help to determine the risk level of a person for certain diseases and medical conditions and help to establish a health baseline. A typical screening will take place in about 15-30 minutes, and consist of a blood draw (finger stick to test your HDL, LDL, Triglycerides, and Glucose) and other basic biometrics (BP, Height, Weight, BMI, and waist circumference). When you put all of these measurements together, you can assess your risk for heart disease, stroke, and diabetes. These illnesses and health conditions can be prevented with early detection, which is why knowing your numbers is so important. Do you know your numbers?

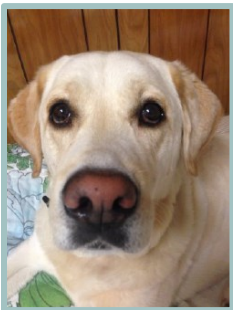


# Community Services

## PRESS RELEASE

### NEW HAMPSHIRE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO CLOSE OFFICES FOR TWO-DAYS DURING SOFTWARE UPGRADE

CONCORD, NH – The NH Department of Safety, Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) will implement a new driver licensing system in October to replace the current system originally implemented in the 1980s. Implementation of the new system will require the closure of all DMV offices on Monday, October 9<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday, October 10<sup>th</sup> and will temporarily limit some services.

“Although temporarily closing DMV offices is required during this transition time, we are aware of how the closure will impact our customers,” said DMV Director Elizabeth Bielecki. “Hopefully, by providing advanced notice, we will minimize the inconvenience this closure will cause.”

During the transition:

- Town/City Municipal clerks will not be able to process the state portion of vehicle registrations from Friday, October 6, through Tuesday, October 10.
- Online services, including Online Driver License Renewal and Online Ticket Pay, will not be available from Wednesday, October 4, through Wednesday, October 11.
- Ticket pay by phone will not be available on Monday, October 9, and Tuesday, October 10. To pay a ticket by phone on another day during normal business hours, please call 1-800-272-0036.

Customers are encouraged to complete DMV transactions regarding driver licenses and registrations in advance of expiration dates if they expire during the transition period. In the days following implementation of the new system, customers may experience longer than usual wait times and are asked to plan their visit accordingly.

# SALEM MUNICIPAL SERVICES

## ENGINEERING DIVISION

Base paving has been completed on Parker Circle, wearing course and driveway paving is coming soon. Work is starting on roads moved up from 2018 with Meadow Lane first, followed by Sylvan Drive, and Carriage Lane. However, schedules are always subject to change, depending on weather, what we encounter in construction, and other factors. Over 100 barrels of contaminated sludge have been removed from structures at the former Waste Water Treatment Facility on SARL Drive. Cleanup and demolition is ongoing. Water main related road reconstruction and paving is complete within the Post Office intersection on South Broadway. We appreciate how patient everyone was as we completed the work, it was certainly disruptive given the volume of traffic on South Broadway and the work involved. Decorative mast arms and other signal equipment is being installed by Tuscan Village at the Post Office intersection and the new signal should be operational soon. Pleasant Street will be closed for about a month to allow for replacement of a 48-inch diameter culvert with a 5-foot high by 11-wide concrete box culvert. Please avoid the area if you can, observe all traffic controls, and look for construction updates on the Town's website.



## PUBLIC WORKS DIVISION



Most of efforts continued to focus around drainage repairs. Photos show a basin repair on Becky Avenue (top left) and a bottom rotted out of corrugated metal pipe (CMP) at a catch basin repair we did on Porcupine Circle (bottom right). We are finding more and more of the CMP has reached its life expectancy and beginning to fail due to rot and corrosion. Bottom right is complete rebuild of catch basin on Corinthian Drive. Top right is failing brick and mortar work on Garabedian Drive that was causing a sink hole since January. This type of work will continue through September and hopefully wrap up in early October.

Work also continues on the Mill and Overlay program.

## UTILITIES DIVISION

Work continues at the former WWTP with removal of the north trickling filter. The contractor is preparing for demolition of the west sedimentation tank now that the mainbuilding basement has been dewatered. Additional concrete sampling from the basement had to be conducted due to the above normal PCB level that was found in the sludge. The deep wet well in the basement was dewatered and cleaned with the pipe access points blocked and sealed. A crane with a man basket had to be used to get personnel into the deep confined space. Canobie Lake is at 217.93' as the end of September approaches and water demand was still below average through the end of August. Sewer manhole maintenance continued this month with a hot mix liquid asphalt that is used to take up the difference in height for raised manholes to avoid issues with plowing in the winter. Flow testing was scheduled to begin so the engineering consultant could begin finalizing the water model for the Town system.

The Planning Board is reviewing a 10 lot subdivision at the Duston Farm parcel on Duston Road. The plan shows single family homes and a public road that is 1100' long.
