Salem Fire Department Battles Large Blaze in Salem Depot



A 3 alarm fire destroyed the building at 80 Main Street early Wednesday morning. The building housed China Star Restaurant, a depot fixture for decades, as well as Vape Venue and 10 occupied residential apartment units. Amazingly, all 13 residents that were home during the blaze escaped. "Clearly the residents heard and acted when the fire alarm sounded" said Paul J. Parisi, Salem's Fire Chief. "This fire stresses the importance of acting quickly when the fire alarm is activated. Seconds count".

Two Salem Firefighters were injured when they were caught in an interior structural collapse in the China Star side of the first floor. Luckily, they were able to free themselves and crawl out of the building. They were treated at Holy Family Hospital in Methuen for non-life threatening injuries. The building ultimately collapsed and was a total loss.

The Salem Human Services office is assisting the families displaced by the fire.



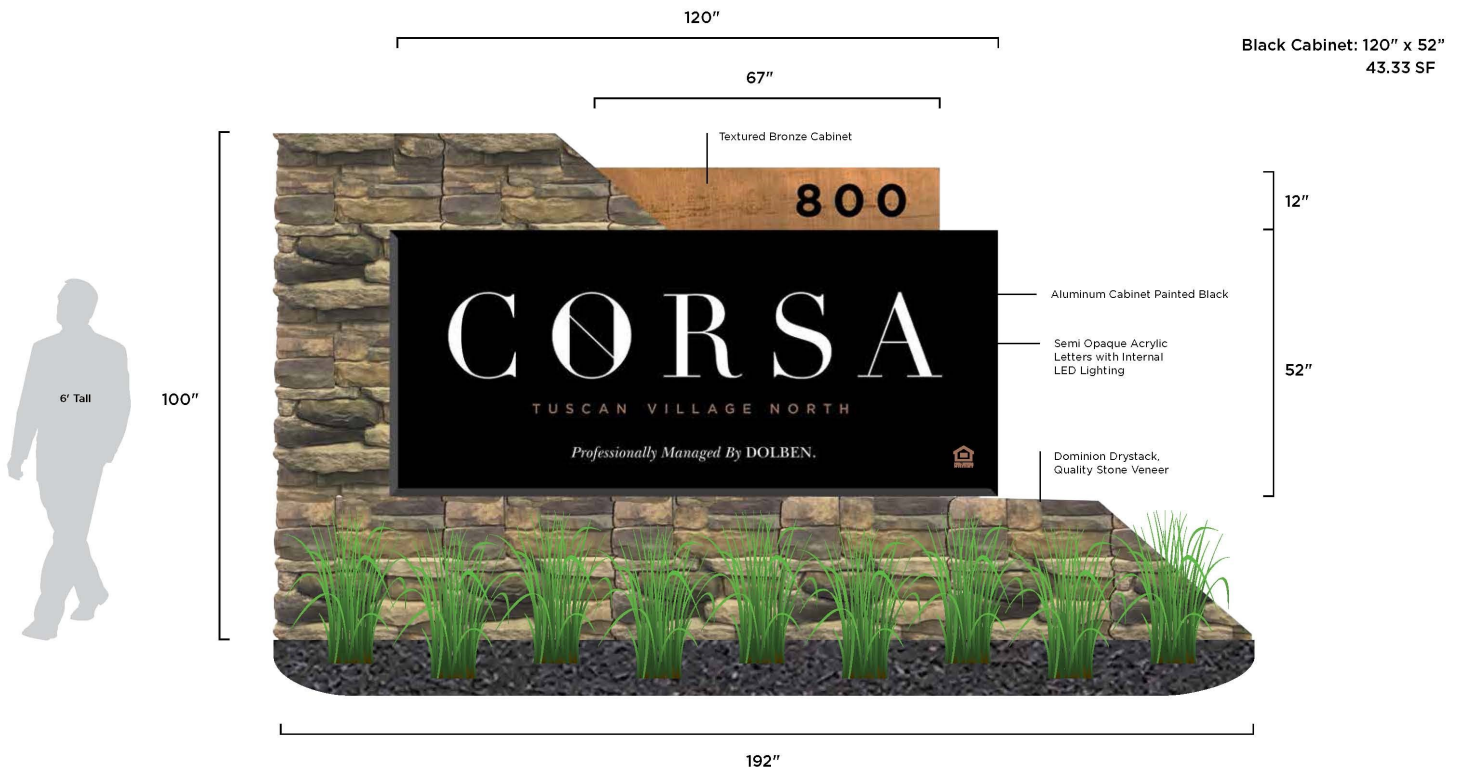

Engineering

South Broadway Sewer, Water, and Bridge Improvement Project

The project involves constructing replacement sewer and water mains on South Broadway between Main Street and Cluff Crossing Road and replacing the bridge north of Friendship Drive. Work will begin south of Cluff Crossing Rd (near Target) and will proceed from south to north, extending to Main Street. It's a two-year project, with challenging construction due to deep sewer mains, so work will proceed slowly. Lane closures are necessary, so expect significant delays and seek alternate routes if possible.

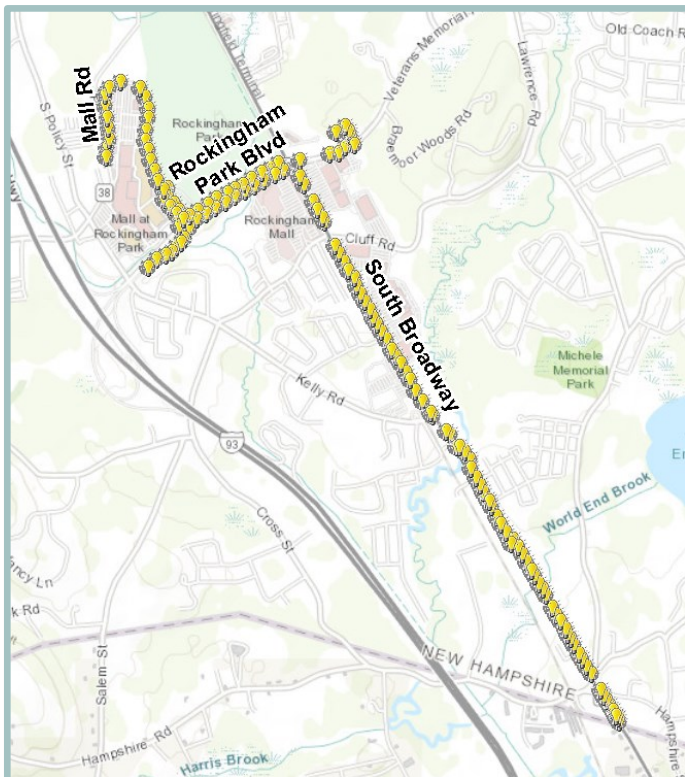

LED Conversion Project-Phase I

The Community Development Department is leading a project with Liberty Utilities to convert existing high pressure sodium streetlights to LED. LED streetlights offer better lighting quality and technology at a reduced electric cost. Liberty Utilities will be starting the conversion program at the Salem/Methuen town line working their way north along South Broadway.

As shown on the map to the left, Liberty Utilities and Salem have developed phase I of the project which includes Mall Road, Rockingham Boulevard and South Broadway down to the Salem/Methuen town line. The target area includes 169 400 watt streetlights, of which, 17 lights are recommended to be removed. The purpose of removing streetlights in Phase I is to reduce redundancy and to further increase electricity cost savings which is estimated to nearly \$40,000 annually. Liberty Utilities estimates the timeline for the project is between now and the end of 2018. Staff will continue to work with Liberty Utilities on the next phase of the project. It is anticipated that the entire town-wide project will take 4 – 5 years to complete.
