If you didn't have to sleep, what would you do with the extra time? I would listen to music, dance and drink wine.


What gets you fired up? When people listen in on your conversation.

Salem Community Television






Salem Bike-Ped Corridor

Volunteers from the Friends of Salem Bike-Ped Corridor (FSBPC) have installed a new bike repair station. The station was donated by the Granite State Wheelmen bicycling club as an enhancement to the Salem Bike-Ped Corridor. It was installed at the Salem end of the rail trail parking lot just north of where the trail crosses Range Road. Volunteers laid a concrete pad with a paver stone apron to provide an attractive and sturdy base for the station. Mulch and plants were added around the base as well.


The station includes an air pump for filling up bike tires, as well as a variety of other bike maintenance and repair tools connected by sturdy steel cables. A bike can be lifted onto the arms of the station for easy access to the bike components and allowing the wheels to spin freely.

Voluntary Water Restrictions

Voluntary Water Restrictions

Irrigation Only

Effective July 23, 2018



Due to the moderate drought conditions in Southern New Hampshire including Salem, the Board of Selectmen have approved Voluntary Water Restrictions to be put in place until such time conditions change. We are asking our customers when watering by means of automatic irrigation systems or manual sprinklers for lawn or landscape, to please do so **on ODD Days only between the hours of 12:00 AM and 7:00 AM**.

The Town of Salem appreciates your cooperation with these **Voluntary Water Restrictions for irrigation or watering of lawns/landscapes** in an effort to conserve water. Please follow Town announcements closely over the coming summer months for further guidance.
