Planning Board

FLOODING IS THE MOST COMMON AND COSTLY DISASTER IN THE UNITED STATES AND CAN HAPPEN ANYWHERE.

However, there are many ways to reduce your home's risk of flooding, and not all of them are difficult or expensive. [A new brochure from FEMA](#) briefly describes some of the smaller, lower cost actions you can take yourself or with minor assistance from others. It also suggests places you can go to find more information about flood mitigation techniques, including some of these.

INSIDE THE HOME

For interior areas below the potential flood elevation, consider making the following alterations:

- Protect your valuable possessions
- Seal your foundation and basement walls
- Install flood vents
- Install a sump pump
- Prevent sewer backups

OUTSIDE THE HOME

For the exterior areas of your property, consider taking the following actions:

- Maintain proper water runoff and drainage
- Improve lot grading
- Reduce impervious surfaces around your home
- Install a rain barrel
- Elevate utilities and service equipment
- Anchor outdoor fuel tanks

Fire Department



SFD Responds to the Massachusetts Gas Incident

On the evening of September 13th a little after 5pm the Fire Department received a call requesting a response to Lawrence, Massachusetts for multiple fires and gas leaks.

The Fire Department immediately sent Engine 1, Tower Ladder 1, Fire Marshal/Deputy Chief Emanuelson and Chief Best to the City of Lawrence. This request and response was followed by another request a short-time later for additional fire units to assist. Engine 2, Engine 3, Squad 1 and Battalion Chief Brackett then responded with Engine 2, Squad 1 and Battalion Chief Brackett going to Lawrence and Engine 3 going to Andover to provide assistance. A total of 25 members from SFD responded on the assigned fire apparatus.

Once the SFD apparatus arrived in Lawrence and Andover, they spent the night going from fire to fire and gas leak to gas leak. The last fire apparatus arrived back home in Salem around 6:30am the following morning.

SFD then again sent Engine 4 and Chief Best on Saturday night the 15th at 7:00pm back to Lawrence as part of a regional Task Force with Departments from Derry, Londonderry, Hudson, Nashua, Goffstown, Manchester, Auburn and Candia to continue to respond to incidents related to the initial gas incident. The Departments were there from 7:00pm to 7:00am the following morning.

Salem Bike-Ped Corridor, Phase II

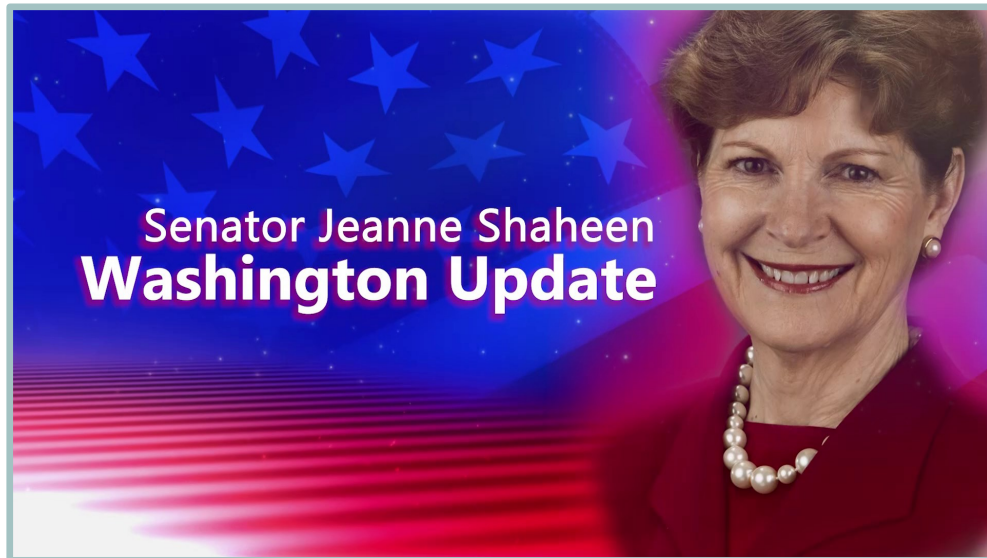
Construction continues on Phase II of the Salem Bike-Ped Corridor. So far, the contractor has worked on mobilization, tree trimming & clearing, grubbing, and temporary erosion control. Next, the contractor will start shaping the trail after the grubbing is complete. Please remember that the trail is closed from Old Rockingham Road to Willow Street during construction. A pedestrian detour is available via the sidewalk on Route 28.

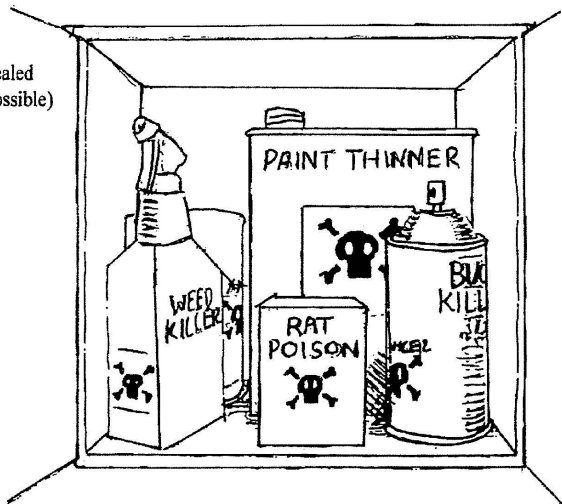

Proof of Residency Required - Such as a Driver's License

What Not To Bring

- Asbestos
- Compressed Gas Cylinders
- Ammunition, Fireworks, Explosives
- Prescription Medicines/Syringes
- Commercial or Industrial Waste
- Infectious & Biological Waste
- Radioactive Waste
- Fire Extinguishers
- Latex Paint (pop lid, let dry, throw away)

To Ensure Safety, Please:

- Tighten caps and lids leaving materials in original labeled containers
- Pack containers in sturdy upright boxes and pad with newspaper
- Sort and pack separately: paint, pesticides, household cleaners
- **NEVER MIX CHEMICALS!**
- Pack your vehicle and go directly to the site **NEVER SMOKE** while handling hazardous materials
- Do not place waste in a garbage bag
