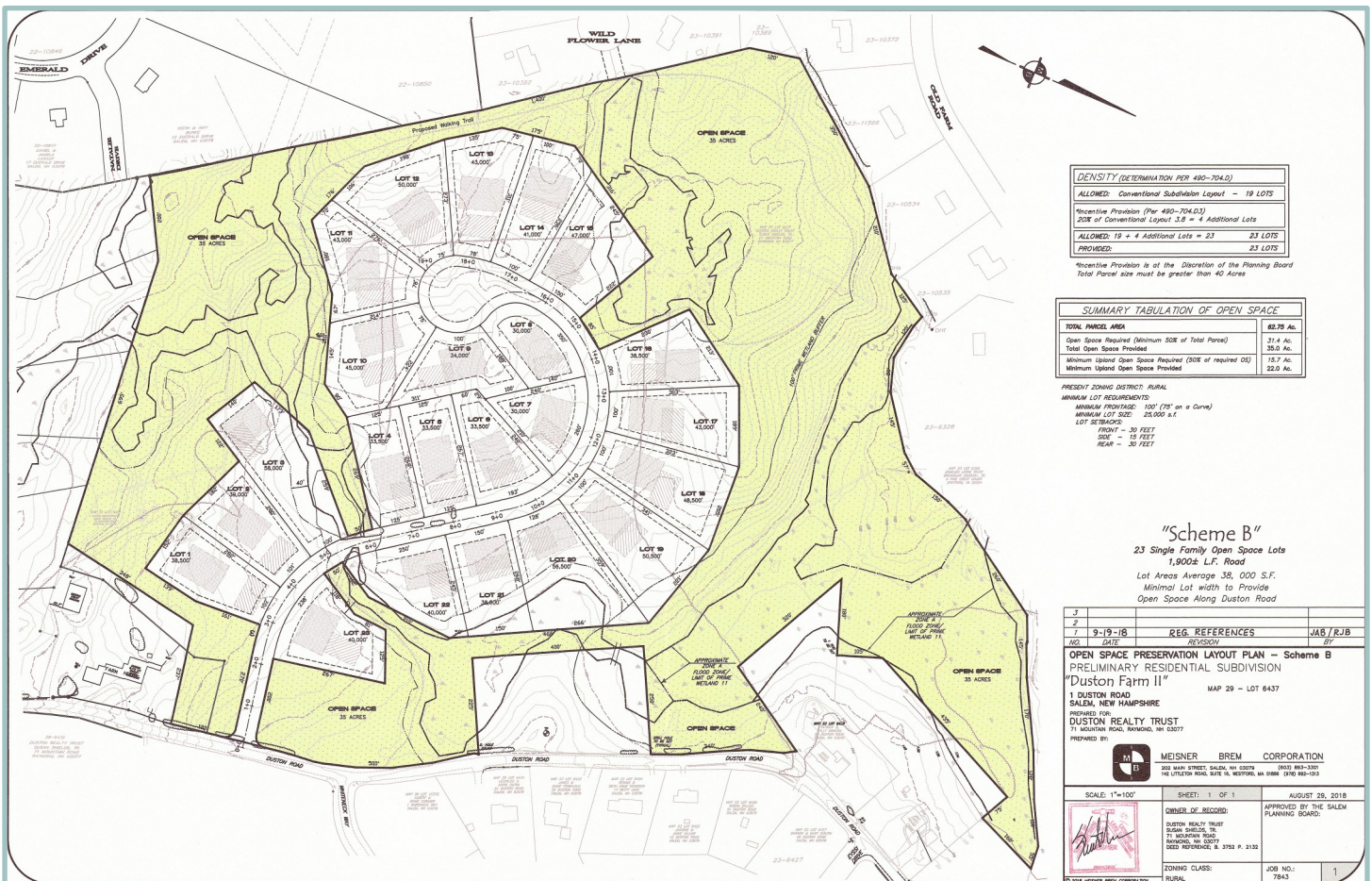

Salem Bike-Ped Corridor, Phase II

Construction continues on Phase II of the Salem Bike-Ped Corridor. Over the past 2 weeks, the contractor has worked on grubbing, temporary erosion control, culvert installation, excavating, forming slopes, gravel installation, and fine grading. The contractor is fine grading and shaping slopes this week, and will pave at the end of the week. Please remember that the trail is closed from Old Rockingham Road to Willow Street during construction. A pedestrian detour is available via the sidewalk on Route 28.

Official Rules:

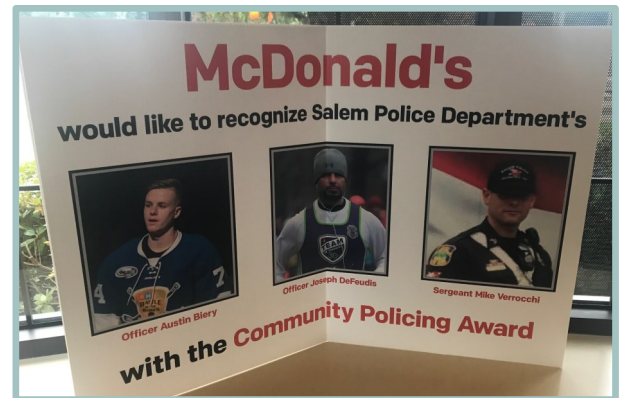
- One scarecrow display submission per household

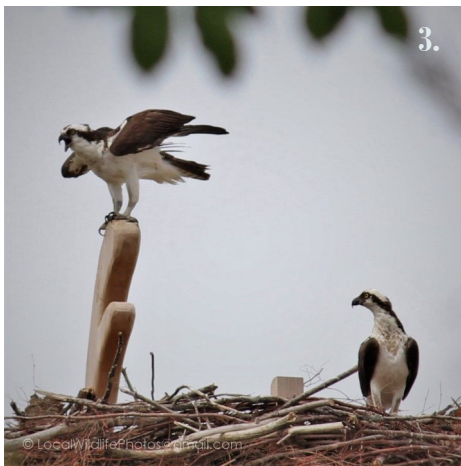
Conservation Commission

The Conservation Commission invited Pat Macoul of Local Wildlife Photos to their October meeting to share her photos and observations of Salem's nesting osprey.

This is a success story. Since at least 2015, a pair of osprey were seen nesting on the top of a light pole on the edge of Rockingham Park. Due to construction last year, there was a need to remove that light pole. With the combined efforts of the Salem Conservation Commission, the NH Fish and Game, the new owners of the property, the construction team, and many more, the nest was saved and relocated. The light pole was taken down only after the osprey had migrated south for the winter, and the nest was moved to a great new platform in a better spot on the edge of the site. As was hoped, the osprey pair successfully found the new nest this year.

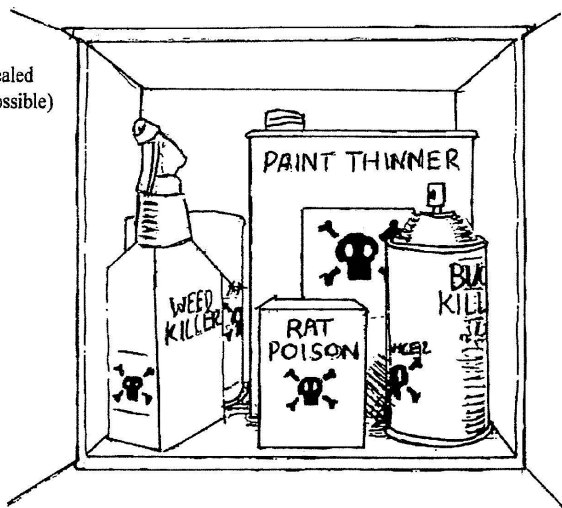
What To Bring

Proof of Residency Required - Such as a Driver's License

What Not To Bring

- Asbestos
- Compressed Gas Cylinders
- Ammunition, Fireworks, Explosives
- Prescription Medicines/Syringes
- Commercial or Industrial Waste
- Infectious & Biological Waste
- Radioactive Waste
- Fire Extinguishers
- Latex Paint (pop lid, let dry, throw away)

To Ensure Safety, Please:

- Tighten caps and lids leaving materials in original labeled containers
- Pack containers in sturdy upright boxes and pad with newspaper
- Sort and pack separately: paint, pesticides, household cleaners
- NEVER MIX CHEMICALS!
- Pack your vehicle and go directly to the site NEVER SMOKE while handling hazardous materials
- Do not place waste in a garbage bag
