We are extremely pleased to announce the Grand Marshal for the 2018 parade is Paul Parisi! The former Fire Chief for Salem was nominated by Gov. Sununu and unanimously confirmed by the Executive Council as the New Hampshire State Fire Marshal this past summer. Please come out to the parade to say hello to State Fire Marshal Parisi and wish him well in his new role!

Anyone is welcome to participate in the parade - businesses, non-profit organizations, antique or extraordinary vehicles, schools, sports leagues, dance companies, musicians, or even neighborhoods in the holiday spirit who wish to get together and build a float. # Conservation Commission

## 2018 Town Forest Hunting Season

\* Hunting on any other dates is prohibited.

\* Hunters must have a valid NH hunting license.

Starts September 1, 2018	Black bear/dates vary for method and WMU
September 2018 – January 2019	Waterfowl/dates vary by species and zone
September 15 – December 15, 2018	Deer/archery
September 15 – December 15, 2018	Fall turkey/archery
October 15 - October 21	Fall turkey/shotgun
October 1 – December 31, 2018	Pheasant
October 20 – October 28, 2018	Moose (by permit only)
October 27 – October 28, 2018	Youth deer-hunting weekend
November 3 – November 13, 2018	Deer/muzzleloader
November 14 – December 9, 2018	Deer/regular firearms

Hunting is allowed in the Salem Town Forest on Shadow Lake Road in accordance with NH hunting laws. Please wear bright clothes or hunter orange if you walk in the Town Forest during hunting season.
