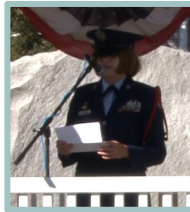

Conservation Commission



The Town recently accepted a land donation of 31 acres along Veterans Memorial Parkway from Steven Lewis and Gino Baroni. The parcel, located on the corner of Braemoor Woods Road, will be maintained as conservation land and allows the wooded character along the roadway to be preserved forever. The Town thanks Mr. Lewis and Mr. Baroni for this important donation.

Salem's Bald Eagles

1. In early May, the adult eagles were often seen flying up to the nest with a fish or other food in their talons for the two chicks.

2. The Eagle adults are sitting on the same branch. The female is on the left. She is larger and the beak seems a little longer. The male, on the right, is smaller and the beak seems shorter and more curved.

3. During the third week in May, one of the adults is beak-feeding the eaglets, which are estimated to be about five to six weeks old.

4. In early July, both eaglets are in the nest calling out to the adults for food.

The New Hampshire Fish and Game recently posted that this year was "an Outstanding Breeding Season for Bald Eagles in the Granite State." Here in Salem, we had at least one pair of bald eagles nesting and they successfully raised two chicks. The nest was in a tall pine tree on private property.

Fire Department

On November 5th the Salem Fire Department received a donation of a storage shelter, valued at \$1,949.00 from the Salem Lions Club. This 12'x20' shelter will be used at Station 1 on Main Street to store the Zodiac inflatable boat- Marine unit #1. Prior to this shelter the Marine unit was stored outside under a make-shift shelter that was not weather tight, so we were constantly removing rain water, snow and ice from inside the boat. Thank you to the Salem Lions Club for your generous donation!



Also on November 5th, the Salem Fire Department received a donation of five Pediatric Ambulance Child Restraints-ACR4, valued at \$4,425.00 from Stacie Levesque and Andrew Burgos of Salem. Stacie and Andrew raised the money through “Grayson’s Fund” in memory of their pediatric son who went into cardiac arrest on September 16, 2017. The Salem Fire Department responded to the incident, but unfortunately we were not able to reverse the cardiac arrest and get his heart beating again. Since then Stacie and Andrew have started an organization in memory of their son called “Grayson’s Fund,” When Stacie and Andrew began the fund their intent was to supply local ambulances with comfort items such as blankets, stuffed animals, and other comfort care items for pediatric/ infant patients. They have since raised so many stuffed animals and blankets for our ambulances that it will be a very long time before we run out. Stacie and Andrew’s most recent fund raising event was a motorcycle ride that was held on September 15th during which they raised several thousand dollars. Stacie called SFD after the motorcycle ride asking to meet with us to discuss what we could use the monies for. We immediately thought of the pediatric patient stretcher securing device project we were working on. After a brief discussion, Stacie and Andrew were all in and wanted to purchase one for each ambulance. We met a couple of more times to work out the details and with the help of Salem Firefighters Relief Association, Stacie and Andrew have funded the purchase of five pediatric patient stretcher securing devices. Thank you to Stacie and Andrew for your generous donation!

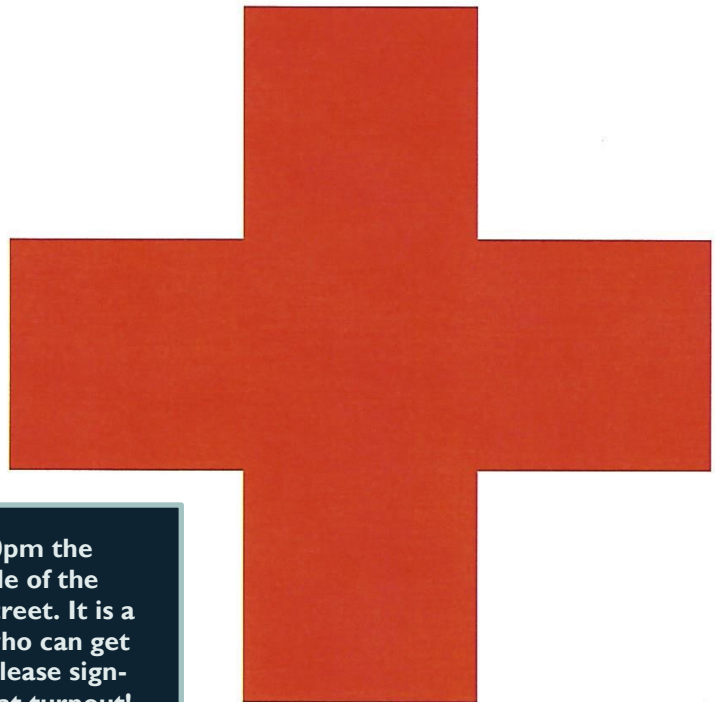

Salem Bike-Ped Corridor, Phase II

Phase II of the Salem Bike-Ped Corridor (Old Rockingham Road to Willow Street) is now open! With the completion of this section, the paved rail trail now extends 9.3 miles from Main Street in Salem all the way to Hood Park in Derry!

The Town of Salem was pleased to work with CMA Engineers and Busby Construction on this project. Thanks for all your hard work to make this successful!

This section was 80% funded by a Transportation Alternatives Program grant with the local match supplied by the Friends of Salem Bike-Ped Corridor through CDFA Tax Credits along with Recreation Impact Fees making up the remainder.

SGC 23 Election Coverage

Election day has come and gone and SGC 23 was part of a ground-breaking effort in regional election coverage. The NH Coalition for Community Media (NHCCM) was able to obtain (on a test basis) new technology that linked 6 cable access TV stations and switch them together in Nashua. The interviews from early in the day were used in the production along with Live interviews.

Daytime interviews included Assistant Moderator Mike Carney, Jr. from North Salem School as he talked about strong voter turnout and voter ID rules. We also heard from Town Moderator Chris Goodnow. He discussed how the absentee ballot requests are an early indicator of voter turnout. Finally, Bernie Campbell at the Soule School talked about the visitor he had from the State's Attorney General's office. He informed us that they look for clearly marked voting rules, location cleanliness, the parking situation, etc. Salem was happy to be a part of this 3 hour "on-air" coverage.
