Community Comes Together in Support of Residents Displaced by Fire



On Saturday evening, February 10 at 11:05 PM the Salem Fire Department's Fire Alarm Office received a fire alarm activation from 99 Cluff Crossing Road, Building A. Within approximately 2 minutes, Fire Alarm began receiving 911 calls reporting a fire

in the building at that location. The first arriving companies found a heavy fire condition on floor #2 out the windows from apartment 8 extending to the 3rd floor, residents hanging out of windows from the 3rd floor of both sides of the building, and reports of other residents trapped in the building. The companies simultaneously began search and rescue efforts as well as fire suppression efforts. Ultimately, 1 resident was rescued from inside the building, 4 were taken out of the building from the 3rd floor over a ground ladder, and 1 resident jumped. Unfortunately the resident that was rescued from inside the building did not survive. Eric Fraser of apartment 8 succumbed to injuries sustained in the fire. Eleven apartments were affected, displacing approximately 30 people.

Since that night, the community has rallied around the residents of 99 Cluff Crossing Building A. The outpouring of support has been nothing short of extraordinary. Donations have poured into the Human Services office; several local businesses have conducted fund raisers including the 99 Restaurant and Isabella's Pizza; storage units were donated by Hampshire Road Self Storage and Morgan

Storage; dumpsters were donated by Dumpster Depot; a port-a-potty was donated by AB Septic; pizza was donated by Romanos and Isabelas; coffee donated by Dunkin Donuts; and the dumpster disposal was donated by LL&S/ ReEnergy. Sizable monetary donations were made by Salem Cooperative Bank, Salem Lion's Club, and the Salem Christmas Fund.

On Saturday morning, February 24, members of the Salem High School Hockey Team, the Greater Salem Rotary Club, the Salem Fire Department, and others arrived back at the fire scene to assist the residents with removing their belongings from their apartments, as the building is slated to be gutted and renovated.

This Saturday, March 3, a spaghetti dinner will be held at the Knights of Columbus hall at 37 Main Street from 5 PM to 8 PM. All proceeds will benefit the residents displaced from the building. Salem Police Benevolent Association is donating all of the food for the meal, and the Salem Firefighters Relief Association is cooking. The event is being coordinated by Dianne Paquette. No RSVP is necessary. Price is \$10 for an adult; \$7 for a child under 12.

Thank you to all who have reached out, donated, volunteered, and/or helped the victims of this tragic fire.

Free Tax Preparation

AARP Tax-Aide is the nation's largest, free, volunteer-run tax counseling and preparation service. Their free service can answer most of the tax issues faced by low and middle-income taxpayers, with special attention to those age 60 and older.

Trained volunteer AARP tax consultants will be available at THREE convenient Salem locations this year, by appointment only. They will be at the Ingram Senior Center February 6th through April 17th on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 9am to 2pm. Seniors may schedule their appointment starting January 22nd by calling the Senior Center at 890-2190 provided they have all of their paperwork ready and complete.

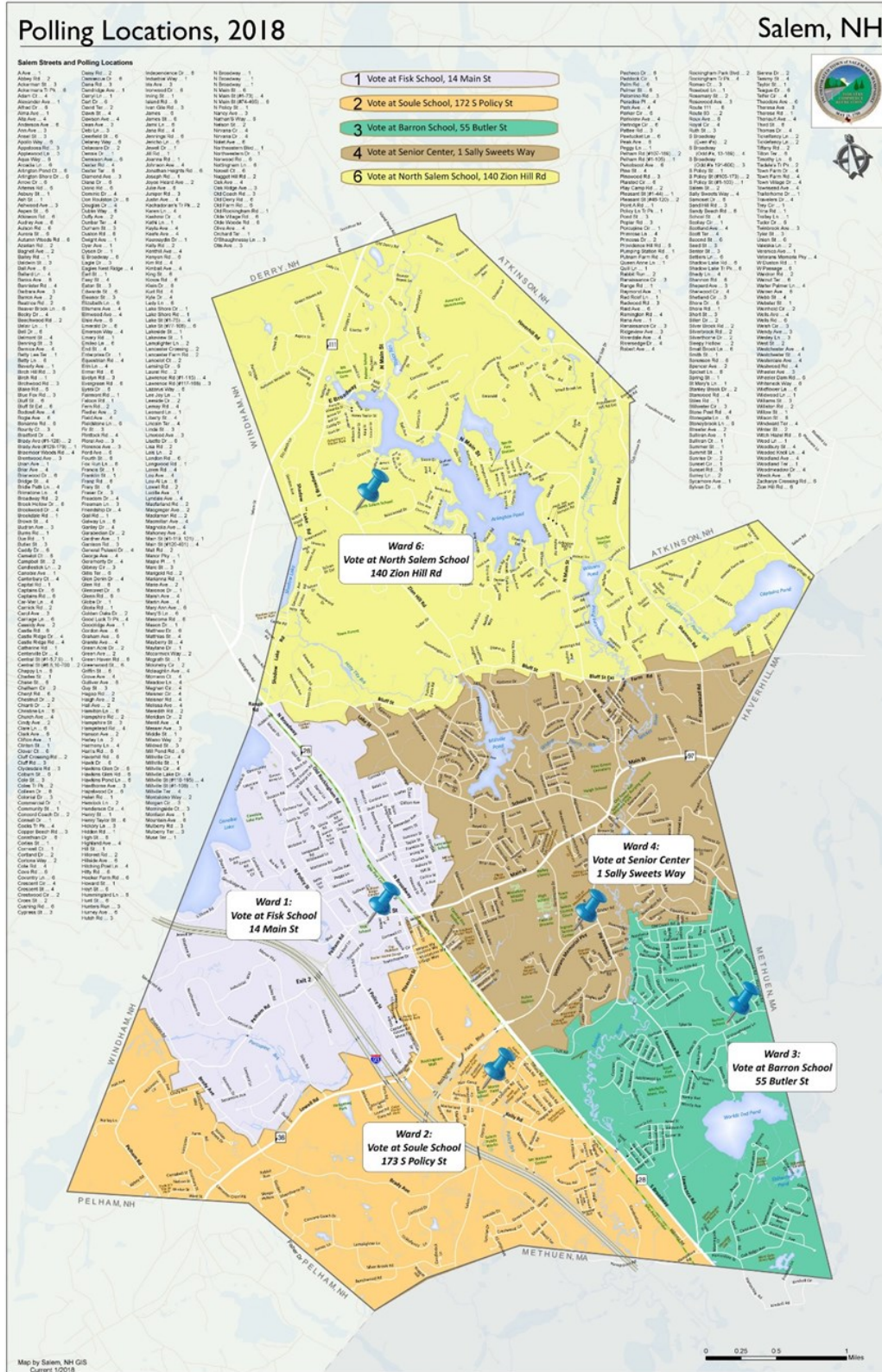
