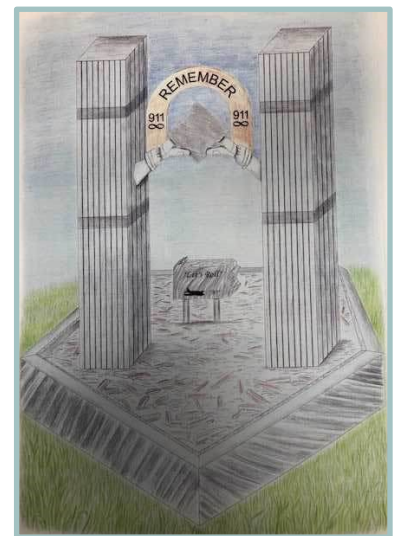
Work Begins on Salem's 9-11 Memorial Monument

The groundbreaking for Salem's 9-11 Memorial Monument was held on Tuesday, June 25th. This crucial work was generously donated by Merrill Construction. Even with a call to Dig Safe, there were some snags along the way, but the 9-11 Monument work has begun!

The entire excavated square is 16'x16'. Dave Cote from Hudson Monuments was also on site to lay out the pattern of the Pentagon for the memorial's base. This is now ready to be moved to the next step. Concrete should be poured by the end of the week.

Unveiling of the 9-11 Memorial Monument is set for September 11, 2019 at 6:00 pm at Veteran's Common. Everybody is welcome to attend.

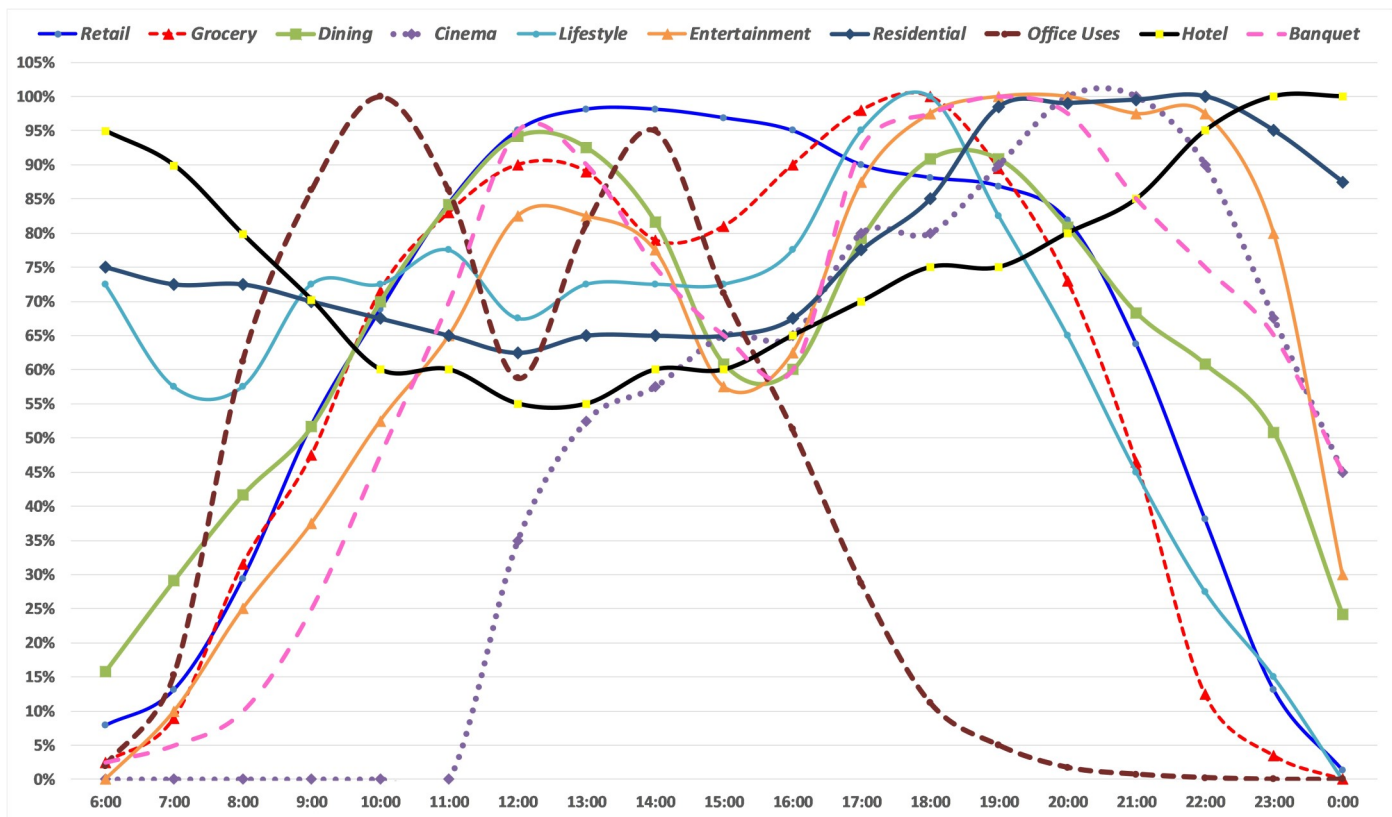

At their meeting on June 18, 2019, the Planning Board approved the site plan for South-Central Tuscan Village, the largest single portion of the Tuscan Village project. We estimate that 85% of the project is now approved. Starting in July 2015, the Board held 44 meetings, heard 73 agenda items, and granted 24 approvals to date. They discussed many complex issues, including floodplains, wetlands, drainage, traffic, parking, architecture, signage, and more.

Activity safety



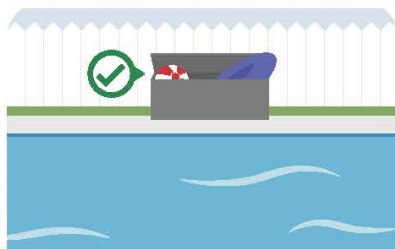
Never swim near a boat, marina or boat launching ramp.

Room Dedication

The Staff Sergeant Edmond Lo—JROTC Center for Leadership & Character Development at Salem High School was dedicated on June 13, 2019. Special thanks to Chief Master Sergeant Tom Puzzo for making the Edmond Lo Room Dedication become a reality.

As a member of the JROTC program at Salem High School, Edmond was Commander of the drill teams, color guard, and Operations Squadron. The Rochester Institute of Technology offered a full three-year scholarship, but Edmond was determined to serve his country.

On June 13, 2009 our country suffered a great loss when Edmond was killed in action while supporting Operation Iraqi Freedom. He was deployed with the 797th EOD Company to Baghdad, Iraq for his second tour of duty with the United States Army. He provided EOD support to the 25th Infantry Division in multi-national division north where he bravely and selflessly eliminated IEDs (Improvised Explosive Devices).

The family of Edmond Lo and the JROTC Committee have been working together for the last 10 years to provide scholarships to students in the JROTC program at Salem High School in memory of SSG Edmond Lam Lo.
