Planning Board



The new Market Basket plaza in Tuscan North Village was approved by the Planning Board in September 2017. The architecture, landscaping, and signage were designed in accordance with the Salem Design Guidelines. Three more stores are expected to join Market Basket and Home Sense in the plaza, along with 4 additional smaller buildings in the parking lot. Tuscan North Village is the first mixed use project in Salem, combining both residential and commercial land uses in close proximity.



Municipal Services

Catch Basin Cleaning

The Department of Public Works has been busy all over town this construction season, milling & overlaying and cleaning the catch basins. Catch basin cleaning is essential in maintaining good water flow. Dave Wholley explained how they check the water levels, inspect the structure of the basin itself, clean it out, and then re-measure to the bottom of the sump. The DPW cleans approximately 1,900 catch basins and they are on a 3 year rotating schedule. It takes about 15 minutes, so if they are on your street just be patient—they leave fairly quickly and it's better than the drains overflowing.

Pine Grove Cemetery Tree Clearing

SGC 23 talked with Municipal Services Director, Roy Sorenson, as he described the Pine Grove Cemetery Expansion. The first step in the expansion process is the harvesting of the trees. Roy explained that with the clearing of the back section of the cemetery, it will accommodate approximately 20-30 more years of cemetery use with just this first phase alone. The trees were cut, stacked, hauled away, and finally the stumps were ground down creating a flat surface for future use.
