

Planning Board



It is our pleasure to announce the recent promotions of Captain Craig Lemire to Battalion Chief/Shift Commander and Firefighter Shane Murphy to Lieutenant and the hiring of Probationary Firefighter Ashton Rome.



Battalion Chief Craig Lemire, Badge #169, has been a member of SFD since October of 2005. He was promoted to Lieutenant in June of 2009 and Station Captain in May of 2016. Craig holds a Bachelors Degree in Management from Stonehill College, is a certified NH Firefighter Level 3, Certified Fire Officer Level 3, and Fire Inspector Level 1. He is also a nationally registered and State licensed Advanced-EMT. Craig is a 3rd generation Firefighter following in his Father's footsteps, who retired as Deputy Chief of Lowell Massachusetts FD and his Grandfather who was a Lieutenant also with the Lowell FD.



Lieutenant Shane Murphy, Badge #189 has been a member of the SFD since August, 2008. Shane holds a Dual Bachelor of Arts Degree in Psychology and Justice Studies from University of New Hampshire, is a certified NH Firefighter 3 and Fire Officer 1, and is a nationally registered and State licensed Advanced-EMT.



Firefighter on Probation Ashton Rome, Badge #237 is a certified Pro-Board Firefighter Level 2 and Advanced-EMT. Prior to coming to SFD Ashton was an AHL Calder Cup Hockey Player for 12 years and small business owner.
