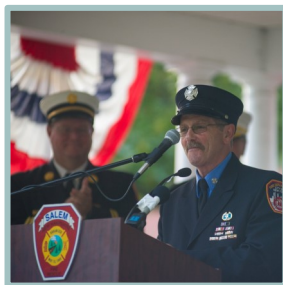

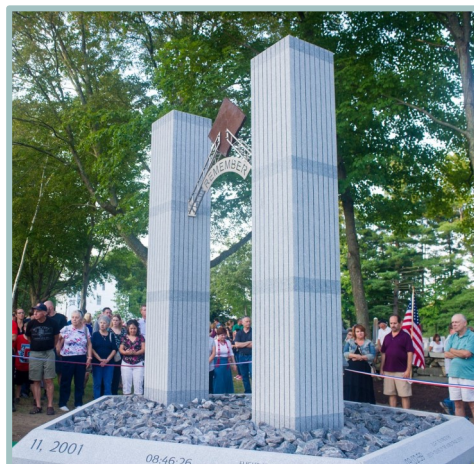
9/11 Never Forget Committee Unveils Memorial Monument



The 9/11 Memorial Monument was opened to the public in a ceremony on September 11, 2019 in front of a large crowd at Veteran's Common. Guest speakers included Governor Chris Sununu, retired NYFD member Bob Sapienza, and 9/11

Never Forget Committee Chairman Pat Hargreaves. They all remarked on the importance of remembering the events of 9/11/01 and honoring the people that lost their lives in the tragedy of that day.

Pat Hargreaves worked with a committee of 16 people who, in conjunction with Dave Cote of Hudson Monuments, helped with the monument's design, fundraisers, and making connections with the various contractors including: Merrill Excavating, P&G Concrete, Toromeo & Kingston Red T Mix Concrete, and Advanced Welding and Design. The monument was thoughtfully designed with many symbolic elements. Many thanks to the Salem DPW whose hard work made the Veterans' Common look like a show piece. The 9/11 Monument Ceremony was a successful event for the Salem community. Salem Community Television covered the entire event which will air on SCTV 17 shortly.

Police Department

Finance

- The Town's 2020 operating budget process is underway. Department heads have submitted their 2020 operating requests to the Town Manager. Over the past two weeks the Town Manager, Finance Director, and Accounting and Budget Manager have met with each department head to review their budget submissions. The Town Manager will now go through the requests and make any modifications that he sees fit. He will then submit his proposed 2020 operating budget to the Board of Selectmen for them to review.
- The Finance Department has recently finalized the paperwork for the lease agreement to lease/purchase a new fire pumper. The fire pumper will be built to order and will likely be complete sometime towards the end of 2020.
- The utility billing division of Finance is continuing to work with Ti-Sales to implement WaterSmart. WaterSmart is a cloud based platform that allows customers to see their water consumption data. When viewing their usage they can add a layer on the graph to get the temperature and precipitation data for the time frame they are reviewing. Customers will be able to sign up with through WaterSmart to receive alerts for various scenarios such as an irregular usage alert, if their usage is trending X% higher than their normal usage, bill forecasts (for example if your bill is on track to be \$30 higher than usual). This platform is not available yet. Our team has biweekly meetings with Ti-Sales and WaterSmart. Due to unforeseen events this process has been delayed about a month but we continue to work to get this platform live.
- Did you know that you can pay your utility bill online? Simply go to the Town's website and pay through our web-site. The online bill processing vendor we use is Invoice Cloud. If you ever have any questions about paying your bill online feel free to contact the Utility Billing Division at 603-890-2042 or 603-890-2047.

- The Finance Department is hard at work processing payroll, paying vendor invoices, answering utility billing questions, ensuring departmental purchases comply with the town's purchasing and procurement policy, and providing support to all Town departments.

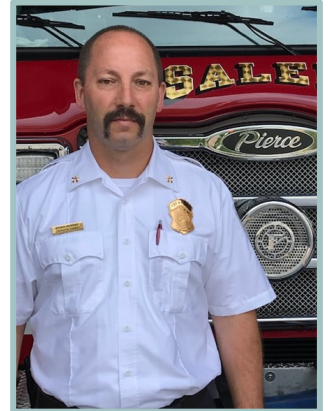
Fire Department



It is our pleasure to announce the recent promotions of Lieutenant/Training Officer Brian Murray to Deputy Chief and Firefighter/Paramedic Michael Galipeau to Lieutenant/Paramedic.

Deputy Chief Brian Murray, Badge #172, has been a member of SFD since September of 2006. He was promoted to Lieutenant in September of 2012, and to Lieutenant/Training Officer in November of 2014. Brian has also served as a full-time Firefighter with the Town of Durham from 1991-2003 and the City of Manchester from 2003-2006. He has over 28 years of full-time firefighter experience plus several years of volunteer and call-firefighter experience.

Brian has an Associates' Degree from the Lakes Region Community College in Laconia (formerly the NH Technical College) in Fire Science. He is also a NH certified Fire Officer Level II and Pro-Board Certified Officer Level III, a Firefighter Level III and a nationally registered and NH licensed EMT, NH Certified Hazardous Materials Technician, Confined Space Rescue Technician, Below Grades Rescue Technician and Swift Water Rescue Technician.



Lieutenant/Paramedic Michael Galipeau Badge #198, has been a member of the SFD since January of 2010. Mike is a certified NH Firefighter 3 and Fire Officer II, and is a nationally registered and State licensed Paramedic. He also is a Fire Instructor III, Fire Inspector Level I and Hazardous Materials Technician. Prior to being employed by SFD, Mike was a Firefighter/EMT with the Hampstead NH Fire Department from November 2005 until 2010.

Remembrance Ceremony

Both Fire and Police participated in our annual remembrance ceremony which is held to remember not only the bravery of the 343 members of the FDNY and 72 law enforcement officers who made the supreme sacrifice on September 11, 2001, so that others could be saved, but also the 2,977 innocent civilians who lost their lives as well.
