Salem DPW is Hard at Work on Improvement Projects

The Salem Public Works Division has been very busy with a number of projects all over town. Give a friendly wave hello next time you see these guys out working hard to improve Salem's infrastructure! Here are a few highlights of their recent projects.



The front porch of Alice Hall Library was recently renovated and given some fresh touch up paint.

It was previously reported that a rollover of a trash truck on Pelham Road at the Exit 2 off ramp caused some roadway damage. We completed the repair on Tuesday by resetting 50 feet of granite curb, milling out damaged and scoured pavement, and repaving.



Construction of the new truck scale at the Transfer Station began Tuesday and is shaping up nicely. Foundations have been set and ready for the scale to be lowered into place by crane and then assembled on October 1st. This new scale is part of a roadway redesign project at the Transfer Station that will help reduce traffic congestion on Shannon Road. Stay tuned for progress updates on this exciting project.


Planning Board




The Planning Board will reviewed a revised plan for the 2nd phase of the Black Brook Realty townhouses in North Tuscan Village at their meeting on September 24, 2019. This [video](#) provides a good overview of how the area could look when completed.

Zoning Board of Adjustment

The Zoning Board of Adjustment will review a proposal for an indoor sports facility at 6 Industrial Way at their next meeting on October 1, 2019. The project requires variances for building height (35' allowed, 75' proposed) and the use, which is not permitted in the Industrial District. The draft site plan shows 2 sports domes, each 230' x 350' in size, on the 16 acre lot, with 197 parking spaces provided. If the Zoning Board grants the variances, the Planning Board will review the full site plan.


