Municipal Services Employees have been hard at work with this year's roadside litter clean-up program. The litter pick-up program is a very important service to the community of Salem, and helps our department to safely maintain roadways. Their dedication to a thorough and efficient job is reflected in the **41 streets and locations** that were picked from April 1, 2019 through April 5, 2019. They filled approximately **900 bags** with paper, cans, bottles, batteries, glass, card board, unmentionables, etc. Other items dealt with were tires, hypodermic needles, illegal signs, and car parts. We are very grateful for their efforts in helping us keeping Salem clean and safe. The total tonnage for 2019 was **3.01 tons/6020lbs.**

Great work, and we all appreciate your commitment to keeping Salem clean, safe and devoid of litter!



Planning Board





The next Planning Board meetings on Tuscan Village are scheduled for April 16, May 21, and June 18.

GIS Flyover

The newly approved Town budget included funding for a new base mapping project commonly referred to as a “flyover”. The flyover is an effort to improve/update the town’s mapping of buildings, roads, pavement, waterbodies, infrastructure and topography. The intent is to establish a new, highly accurate baseline that can be actively maintained by the GIS staff as new projects get approved and built. Deliverables will include new high resolution (3") aerial photography and a new database of observable features and topography. The Town has also opted for delivery of a 3-d model of Salem that may be used for engineering and community design efforts.

The contractor’s airplane is intended to be overhead in the 2nd week in April. A town the size of Salem will require 12 flightlines, roughly an hour and a half of flight time. The Town will start to see deliverables in June, with final products available in the fall.



Fire Department



On Saturday March 30th, four Salem Firefighters, Josh Gagnon, Patrick Emanuelson, Robbie Douglas and Andrew Owens participated in the American Lung Association fundraising event FIGHT FOR AIR CLIMB, by climbing 41 floors and 789 stairs in full gear and SCBA air-pack (60 pounds of gear!), at one Boston Place. The SFD members were joined by 450 other local firefighters who also climbed the Boston skyscraper. We want to extend a sincere thank you to everyone who donated to this extremely worthy cause. Each member said they “We’re honored to participate in this event to raise money and awareness for the ALA.”

The Fight for Air Climb is a signature fundraiser event of the ALA, and climbs are held annually in skyscrapers across the United States. Participants climb their way up hundreds of stairs with the goal of raising money to support the ALA’s lung health research, patient education and public policy efforts.

Altogether the SFD Firefighters raised almost \$1,100 and the Boston event raised a total of \$399,495 for the ALA! Great job guys! SFD is proud of you!


