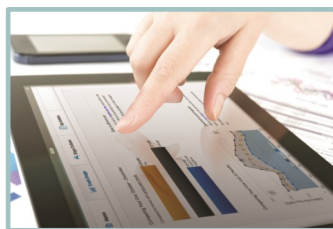

WaterSmart Portal Now Available to Salem Water Customers

The Town of Salem, NH has partnered with WaterSmart Software to provide our customers with the ability to see their water consumption data. The WaterSmart portal is a great resource for customers to better understand their water use. Customers can sign up for automated alerts that will notify the customer of potential high volume or continuous flow (which may be indicative of a leak) as well as bill forecast notifications. WaterSmart is a data driven customer engagement and analytics platform, offering greater insight and control over water use in your home or business. The best part is that it is free for our customers.



Once you become an active participant on your WaterSmart page, you'll learn about your home's water

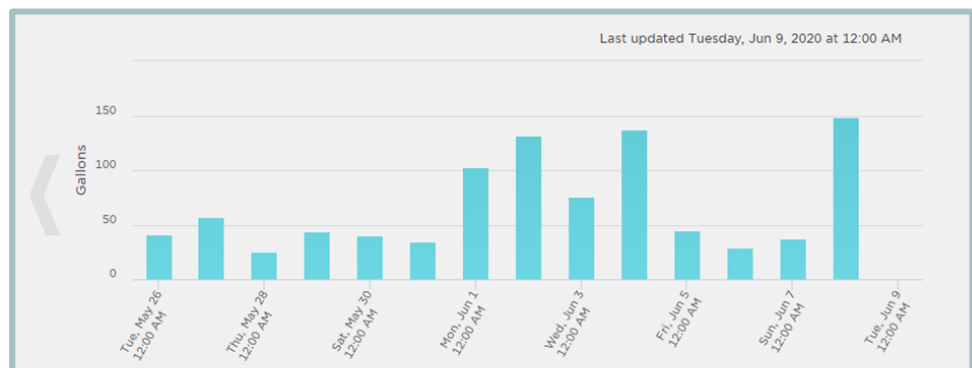
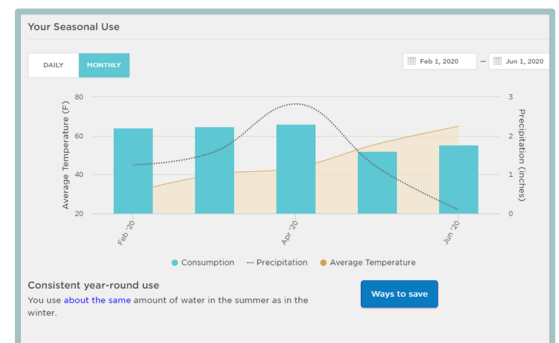

Planning Board



Southwest Perspective

Town Hall closed to public access in mid-March due to the coronavirus pandemic. The Planning Board began holding remote meetings on April 14, 2020, in accordance with Governor Sununu's emergency orders. Public participation is possible through email and telephone calls before and during any meeting. Also, the public can watch the meetings at www.sgc23.com or on local cable station 23. Applicants, Board members, and various Town staff have worked hard to make remote meetings work and continue the development review process.

One recent approval granted by the Planning Board is for the former D'Angelo's sub shop on the corner of South Broadway and Pattee Road. The existing building will be removed and Century Bank will construct a new building on the lot, furthering the Town's goal to encourage redevelopment of older commercial sites on South Broadway.

Fire Department



It is our pleasure to announce the recent promotions of Lieutenant Corey Ward to Captain and Firefighter/Paramedic Gerald Mackey to Lieutenant/Paramedic.

Captain Corey Ward, Badge #186 has been a member of the SFD since August of 2007. He was promoted to Lieutenant in May of 2014. He is a certified NH Firefighter 3 and Fire Officer II, a Nationally Registered and State licensed Advanced EMT and a Fire Instructor I. Corey was a Firefighter/EMT with the Hampstead NH Fire Department from 2005 until 2007 and is also currently a call member with the Danville Fire Department, serving as the Assistant Fire Chief.

Salem High School Graduation

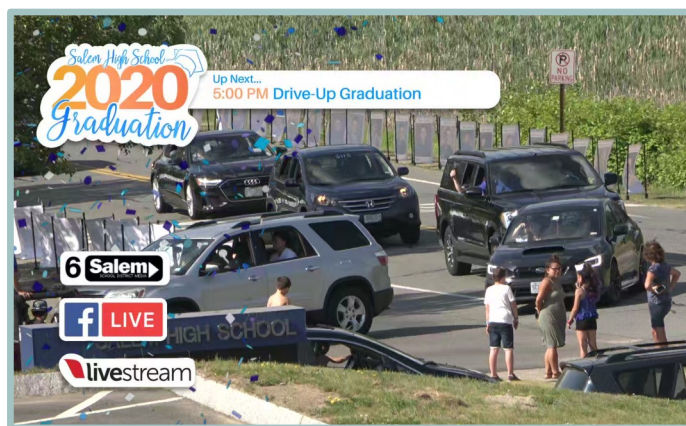

Zoning Code Enforcement

Zoning code enforcement efforts have continued steadily during the past few months despite the pandemic. So far this year, 73 zoning complaints have been received. Many of the complaints we receive involve disturbance of wetlands, businesses at residential addresses, unregistered vehicles, noise, and a variety of miscellaneous issues, even including an encampment on Town land. Approximately 65 complaints, including 12 complaints that have carried over from previous years, have been resolved so far this year. We continue to address the backlog of persistent violations, some of which have been in place for years.
