- Eliminate Beach Advisories




Stormwater is the #1 Cause of Water Quality Impairments in New Hampshire

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## Background




- General Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permit issued May 2003
- Five-year permit cycle expired May 2008
- 2003 Permit “administratively continued”
- 2017 Permit effective July 1, 2018
- Notice of Intent submitted October 1, 2018

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## Regulated Area in Salem

- “Urbanized Area” as defined by 2000 and 2010 Census
- MS4 Discharges to “Waters of the US”



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## Salem's MS4

- 4,967 Catch Basins
- 741 Drain Manholes
- 1,101 Outfalls
- 465 Culverts
- 85 miles of Drainage Pipe

Number of  
Regulated  
Outfalls = 600+

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## 2017 vs. 2003 MS4 Permit

- Greater Accountability
- More detailed requirements & stricter timeframes for BMP implementation
- More Documentation
- Enhanced Reporting Requirements
- More Prescriptive Requirements for Impaired Waters


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## Public Participation and Involvement

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## Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination (IDDE)

- MS4 mapping (GIS) - *Complete*
- Written IDDE Plan – *Complete*
- Catchment Delineation/Ranking - *Complete*
- Dry/wet weather outfall sampling – *Initiated but none conducted in 2018/2019*
- IDDE Investigations – *2016*
- In-House Training - *Complete*

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## Construction and Post – Construction Site Runoff Control

- Update municipal code – *Draft Form (Subject to Future Meeting)*
- Assess / report on regs - street / lot design
- Assess / report on regs - barriers to green / LID - *Ongoing*
- Identify 5+ town properties for BMP retrofits




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## Chapter 417 - Stormwater Management and Controls

- Illicit Discharges
- LID Site Planning and Design
- BMP Design Guidance
- Retention/Treatment Requirements
- As-Builts/Long-Term O&M
- Phosphorus/Chloride/Metals Impairments
- Drinking Water Supply Sources



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## Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping

- Inventory/Written O&M procedures for municipal activities and facilities – *Draft Procedures Developed*
- Enhanced Catch basin cleaning - *Ongoing*
- Enhanced Sweeping of streets / municipal lots - *Ongoing*
- Inspection & maintenance of BMPs
- Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plans – *Draft Developed for DPW Facility*

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## Impaired Waters - Approved TMDLs

- **Bacteria**
  - ✓ Enhanced Street Sweeping
  - ✓ Additional Public Education and Outreach initiatives
  - ✓ Phosphorous Source Identification Report
- **Chloride** (Policy-Porcupine Brook)
  - ✓ Chloride Reduction Plan



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## Water Quality Limited Waters – Without Approved TMDL

- Captain Pond is impaired for **Phosphorus**, which requires:
  - ✓ Enhanced Street Sweeping
  - ✓ Additional Public Education and Outreach initiatives
  - ✓ Phosphorous Source Identification Report
  - ✓ BMP Implementation – *One Project Completed at Captain Pond*



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## Water Quality Limited Waters – Without Approved TMDL

- Policy Brook and an unnamed tributary to Harris Brook are impaired for **Chloride**, which requires:
  - ✓ Chloride Reduction Plan



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## Water Quality Limited Waters – Without Approved TMDL

- Policy Brook is impaired for **Iron**, which requires:
  - ✓ Enhanced Street Sweeping/Catch Basin Cleaning
  - ✓ Regulatory Updates

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## Records / Reporting

### Many New Reporting Requirements

- More comprehensive annual reports
- Will need to
  - Document EVERYTHING
  - Keep comprehensive records
- We suggest
  - Understanding / taking credit for ALL that you do
  - Moving away from paper
- **Annual Reports Due September 30, 2019**
