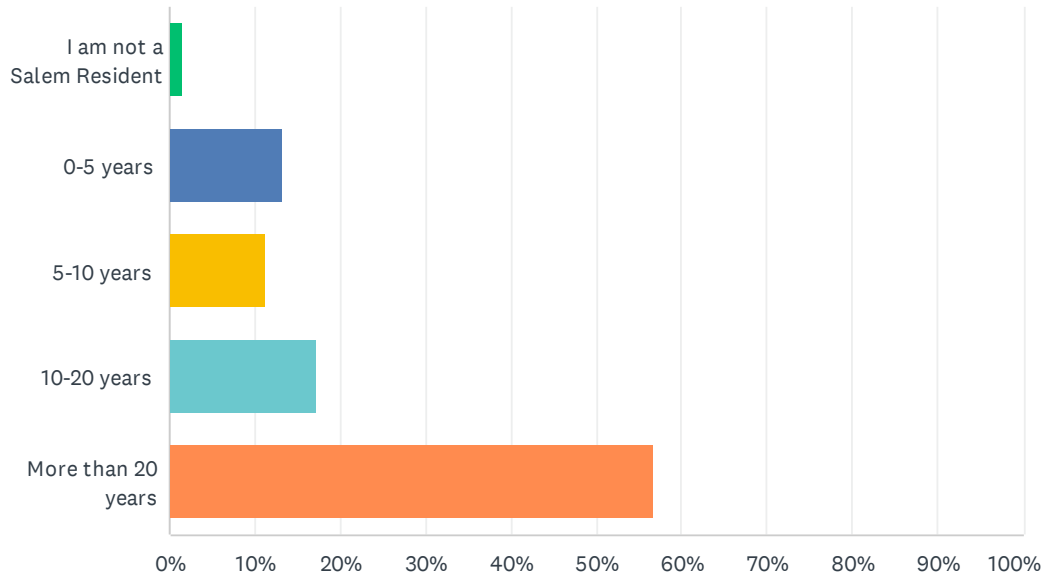


Q1 How long have you been a Salem resident?

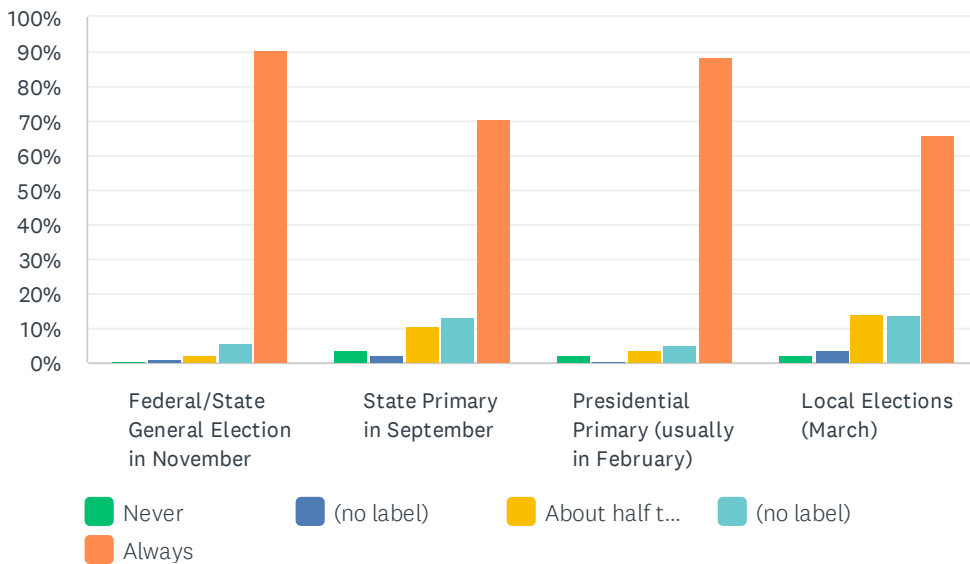

Q2 With 1 representing “Never” and 5 representing “Always” please rate how often you vote in the following elections.

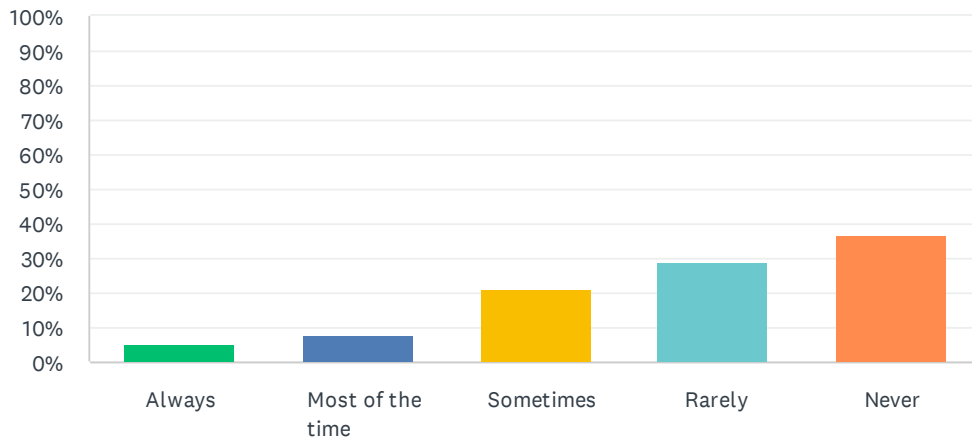

Q3 Do you attend the Deliberative Session for Town elections?

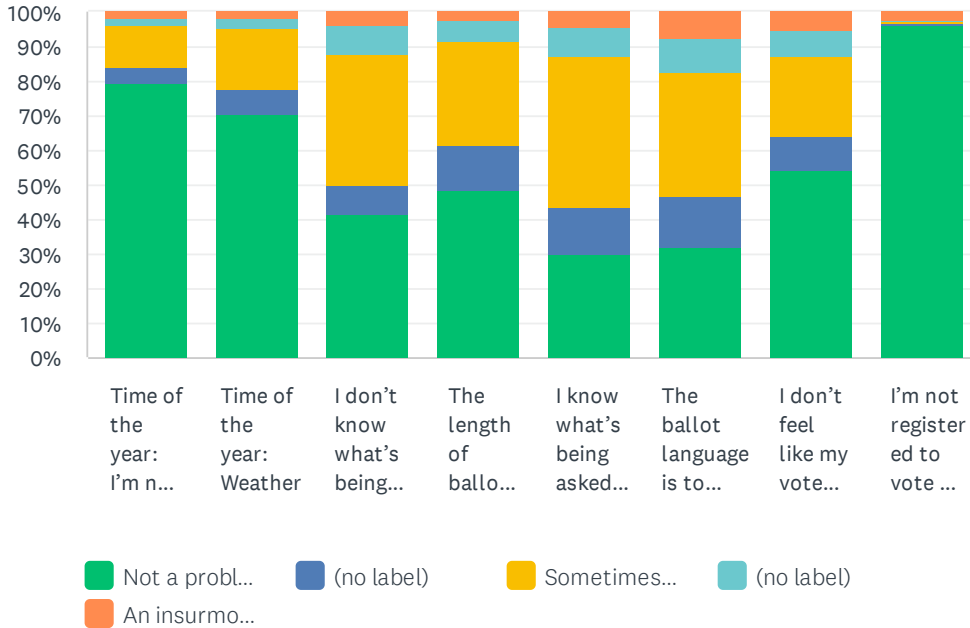

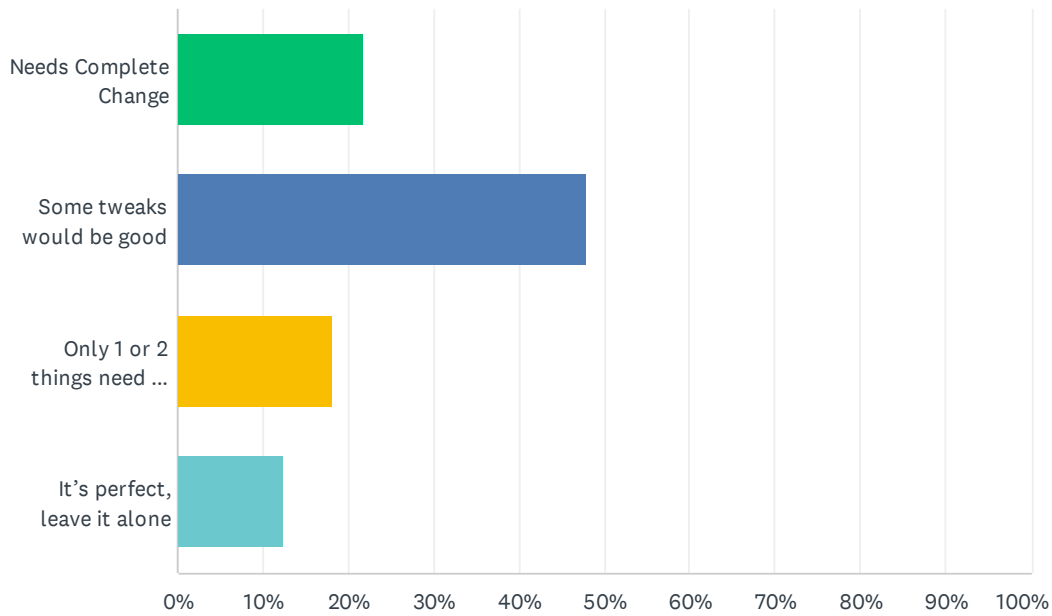

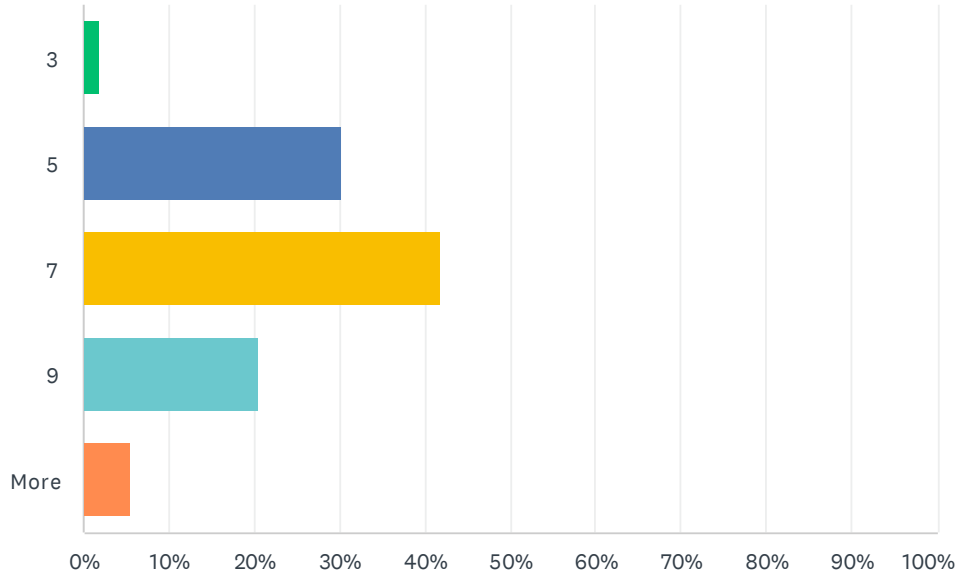

Q11 How many representatives do you feel Salem needs in its governing body?

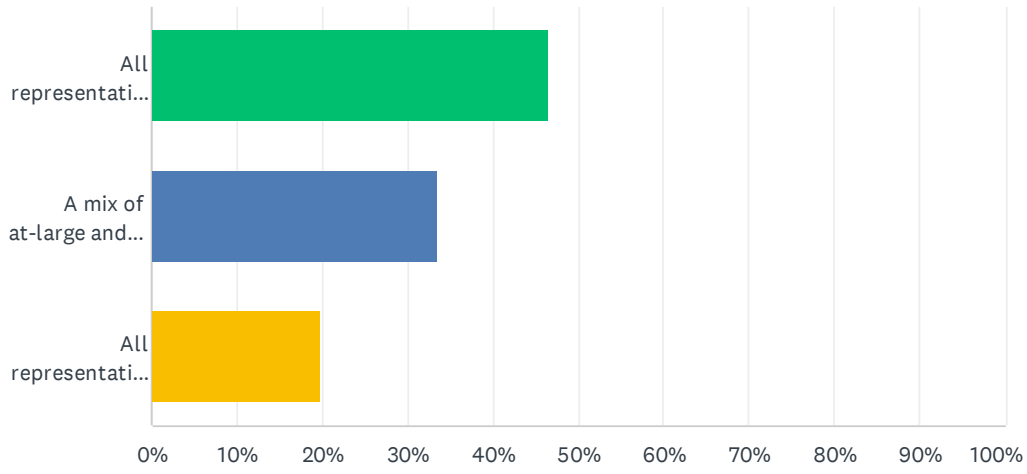
